## Airport Advisory Committee Minutes April 4, 2023

# Call to Order by Victoria at 5:07 PM

- 1. Acceptance of previous minutes
  - a. Motion to approve by Ron; 2<sup>nd</sup> by John; approved unanimously.
- 2. Adjustments to agenda
  - a. Discussion of Tractor
  - b. Peter Lehmann
- 3. Old Business
  - a. Budget
    - i. No discussion about interest-bearing account.
  - b. Tractor is returned and repaired
    - i. Cost \$6,200
      - 1. Included replacing front differential
    - ii. Mower attachment not yet located
      - 1. Said to be in a hangar, but unable to search hangars at present
  - c. Fuel Farm
    - i. Selling Jet-A at \$2.50/gallon for non-aviation use.
      - 1. Somewhat less than purchase price of \$2.70/gallon
    - ii. Some fuel has been sold to private individuals.
    - iii. RF Foster will purchase.
    - iv. When tank empty, can be inspected/repaired/certified by NH company
      - 1. We will then purchase less than 2,500 gallons (probably 1,000) so we will be able to add fresh fuel every six months so as to be able to "refresh".
    - v. Entire fuel system will be re-certified.
    - vi. Inspection, repair, recertification by LR Fuel Systems of NH (Contact: Roy Creely).
    - vii. Some discussion as to whether we really need to be selling Jet-A, in view of limited sales recently
      - 1. Limited sales due to airport closure (do to runway re-do project)
      - 2. Sales expected to increase in the future.
      - 3. Chris mentioned turboprop owners (like himself) are sensitive to pricing
  - d. Leases
    - i. Still being reviewed by both DK and also city attorney for compliance
  - e. Solar Farm
    - i. Drawings from HT show layout proposed by Nexamp last October.
    - ii. This shows multiple areas for panels around the approach end of Rwy 32.

- iii. In order to have a full-length parallel taxiway, as proposed by HT at City Council presentation recently, we would have to change Airport Category from B-1 to A-1 so as to reduce the required Taxiway-Runway distances and also the obstruction-free areas.
- iv. It is unclear why this location was chosen instead of the old "blade yard"
- v. Apparently city has a signed contract with Nexamp but no committee member has seen it.
- vi. To be investigated:
  - 1. How would airport be impacted by change from B-1 to A-1
    - a. Will reach out to HT
  - 2. Can the blade yard be used instead?
    - a. Nexamp representatives to return April 26, 2023 @ 1 PM for site visit to consider and discuss this.

### f. Computers

- i. Reboot sequence for GARD and DigiWx are now posted.
- g. Apron project
  - i. The portion of the apron north of the fuel farm is deteriorating with concern for heavy a/c getting stuck there and will be redone.
  - ii. Sargent hopes to start this work in the fall
  - iii. Awaiting release of FAA funds
    - 1. All other funding issues in place according to Kate
  - iv. Time frame:
    - Start Aug/Sep (could be sooner if funds released)
    - 2. Must start by 9/30/2023 or bid is cancelled and must be resubmitted
    - 3. 28 days to finish. \$1,800/day penalty for each day over 28 days.
- h. Terminal building funding
  - i. We were not selected this year.
  - ii. Hopefully, HT will be getting copy of successful bid to help in reformulating our re-application in the future.

#### 4. New Business

- a. Runway Lights
  - i. Three are broken, but two only require replacement of the frangible fitting
    - 1. One will need to be replaced entirely.
  - ii. Parts will be ordered from Flight Light and replaced by Peter Lehmann
- b. Victoria has been acting as the Airport Operations Manager but is now resigning from that position due to medical issues.
- c. Coleen has been appointed to the City Council. She will probably need to resign from this committee.
- d. Proposals for new members
  - i. Bob Chieffo
    - 1. Lives in Eastport, very interested in airport.
  - ii. Peter Lehmann
    - 1. Lives in Pembroke.
    - 2. Significant aviation employment experience and education per submitted resume.
    - 3. Also may be interested in assuming some Airport Manager tasks.
  - iii. Motions
    - 1. Motion by John Foster: In view of the regional nature of the Airport, request that the council allow non-Eastport residents to be full voting members of the Airport Advisory Committee.
      - a. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chester
      - b. Discussion:
        - i. The Airport is promoted as a Regional Airport.
        - ii. The FAA considers the Airport to be a Regional Airport.

- iii. There are a number of stakeholders who reside outside the city limits and have valuable aviation experience.
- c. Approved unanimously.
